Keys to Success at BAYS:

- Please make sure to contact your case manager if you will miss any appointments, classes, or school days.
 - To reach your case manager, call their cell phone. Text messages can also be read and responded to.
 - When attempting to reach your case manager, leave a voice mail message if they do not answer. They will contact you within 24 hours of leaving the message.
 - All out of town vacations and travels must be approved by your case manager. Any travel without permission will be considered noncompliant behavior.
 - Proper dress and attire is expected when attending school, program classes, and any meetings with your case manager. School dress code should be followed, for example, no halter tops, mid-drift exposure, pants tied below the waist, etc.
- ** We are a professional agency and expect that everyone involved with our programs acts in the same fashion. Violations of these or any other requirements is considered noncompliance and may result in an unsuccessful closure from our program.**
